2024 FINANCIAL STABILITY IMPACT AREA

Vision: A community that provides education, support, resources, and opportunities to achieve financial stability.

Goal: United Way will partner with evidence-based programs that give community members a chance for a brighter future and a path toward achieving financial stability.

Priority Populations:

While individuals and families in need may exist beyond what is noted, United Way will first invest resources in the population identified below:

- Individuals and families (households) at or below 200% (FPL) Federal Poverty Level and ALICE* (Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed) thresholds.
- Individuals and families for which various social determinants of health** are barriers to their success.
- Seniors 65 and older or those with varying abilities who live at or below 250% of the FPL.

Priority #1: Provide priority populations access to programs and services that help them establish and manage their path toward employment opportunities and the building of financial stability.

Strategies:

- Connect workers to community resources that help manage child care, transportation, and other challenges to job acquisition, attendance, and performance.
- Support skills development, experiential opportunities, career coaching, and placement services for individuals to explore interests that prepare them for employment and increased economic security.
- Support programs that provide employment barrier navigation and enable low-wage earning individuals to acquire basic education, post-secondary training, and the social skills needed to increase economic security.

Priority #2: Provide priority populations with unmet financial and housing needs access to services and programs that directly address these basic needs.

Strategies:

- Support programs that help individuals and families transitioning from shelters to receive support and placement services that increase income opportunities and build financial stability.
- Support programs that provide case management, coaching, mentoring, information and referral, and/or other methods, to help individuals achieve employment, financial stability, and financial security.
- Support coordination of services for seniors and individuals with varying abilities that improve in-home services, care transitions, transportation, and nutrition.

***ALICE THRESHOLD:** the difference between what is earned and the cost of living in that county or 200% of (FPL) Federal Poverty Level. As of Board approval date _____ almost one-third of Portage County households were at or below the ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) Threshold

****SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH:** life-enhancing resources, such as food supply, housing, economic and social relationships, transportation, education, and healthcare, whose distribution across populations effectively determines length and quality of life.
