2024 HEALTH IMPACT AREA

Vision: A community where all members have equitable access to quality healthcare and live in a safe and healthy environment.

Goal: United Way will partner with evidence-based programs that improve behavioral, mental, and physical health and wellness.

Priority Populations:

While individuals and families in need may exist beyond what is noted, United Way will first invest resources in the populations identified below:

- Individuals and families (households) at or below 200% (FPL) Federal Poverty Level and ALICE* (Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed) thresholds.
- Individuals and families for which various social determinants of health** are barriers to their success.
- Seniors 65 and older or those with varying abilities who live at or below 250% of the FPL.

Priority #1: Support access, affordability, and delivery of mental, behavioral, and physical health services for community residents.

Strategies:

- A. Expand and enhance support for providers and programs that make available mental health services for youth before, during, and after the school day.
- B. Support the development of behavioral health services that address barriers to access including the creation of non-traditional office hours and locations, web-based resources and direct inquiry resources, case management, and innovative community education.

Priority #2: Provide prevention education, intervention, and support services to individuals and families to reduce the incidence of child maltreatment and relationship violence.

Strategies:

- A. Support programs that deliver intervention services to victims of child maltreatment and relationship violence.
- B. Support prevention and services that increase knowledge of parenting and child development.

Priority #3: Support community members in managing health challenges

Strategies:

- A. Provide support and access to resources for community members caring for those who have cognitive, physical, and mental health conditions, either at home or within the community.
- B. Support the delivery of evidence-based programming that coordinates resources to provide comprehensive support to individuals with challenges to achieving healthy living.

***ALICE THRESHOLD:** the difference between what is earned and the cost of living in that county or 200% of (FPL) Federal Poverty Level. As of Board approval date _____ almost one-third of Portage County households were at or below the ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) Threshold

****SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH:** life-enhancing resources, such as food supply, housing, economic and social relationships, transportation, education, and healthcare, whose distribution across populations effectively determines length and quality of life.
